

**EPISTLE READING OF THE DAY:** This morning's Apostolic Reading is from the Letter of Saint Paul to the Romans, chapter 13, verses 11-14, chapter 14, verses 1-4. It is found in our books on page 137.

**Ὁ Απόστολος, πρὸς Ῥωμαίους ἐπιστολῆς Παύλου τὸ ἀνάγνωσμα, κεφ. 13, ἐδάφ. 11-14, κεφ. 14, ἐδάφ. 1-4:** Ἀδελφοί, νῦν ἐγγύτερον ἡμῶν ἢ σωτηρία ἢ ὅτε ἐπιστεύσαμεν. Ἡ νῦξ προέκοψεν, ἡ δὲ ἡμέρα ἤγγικεν· ἀποθώμεθα οὖν τὰ ἔργα τοῦ σκότους, καὶ ἐνδυσώμεθα τὰ ὄπλα τοῦ φωτός. Ὡς ἐν ἡμέρᾳ, εὐσχημόνως περιπατήσωμεν, μὴ κώμοις καὶ μέθαις, μὴ κοίταις καὶ ἀσελείαις, μὴ ἔριδι καὶ ζήλῳ. Ἀλλ' ἐνδύσασθε τὸν κύριον Ἰησοῦν Χριστόν, καὶ τῆς σαρκὸς πρόνοιαν μὴ ποιήσθε, εἰς ἐπιθυμίαις. Τὸν δὲ ἀσθενοῦντα τῇ πίστει προσλαμβάνεσθε, μὴ εἰς διακρίσεις διαλογισμῶν. Ὡς μὲν πιστεύει φαγεῖν πάντα, ὁ δὲ ἀσθενῶν λάχανα ἐσθίει. Ὁ ἐσθίων τὸν μὴ ἐσθίοντα μὴ ἐξουθενείτω, καὶ ὁ μὴ ἐσθίων τὸν ἐσθίοντα μὴ κρινέτω· ὁ θεὸς γὰρ αὐτὸν προσελάβετο. Σὺ τίς εἶ ὁ κρίνων ἀλλότριον οἰκέτην; Τῷ ἰδίῳ κυρίῳ στήκει ἢ πίπτει. Σταθήσεται δέ· δυνατὸς γὰρ ἐστὶν ὁ θεὸς στήσαι αὐτόν.

From the depths of Hades has He delivered us, and to all the world has granted His great redeeming mercy.

**WAITING FOR THE RAINS TO STOP:** Our landmark Cathedral, which you are creating—a center of our Greek Orthodox faith in the heart of the City is waiting for completion of the exterior, once the rains stop. You should be very proud of what you are accomplishing. Do share the good news with your friends, relatives and neighbors. Invite them to come and see what you are doing in response to God’s invitation, *“Build me a Sanctuary, and I will appear among you.”* (Translated from the Septuagint: *Καὶ ποιήσεις μοι ἅγίασμα, καὶ ὀφθήσομαι ἐν ὑμῖν*). (Exodus 25:8). Meanwhile, as for specifics, waterproofing of the deck and around the garage will resume once the rains have ceased. The entrenchment drain will also be constructed, as well as the housing for the garage exhaust ducts. Meanwhile, the archways are also being restored. And that’s about it for the exterior ---oh, yes, we will also install temporary doors; the permanent doors will be installed when the interior is completed, before using the space.

Now for the interior: we hope to do much of the upper wall installation by the end of 2017, as your generosity permits. For us to continue, we need your prayers and your continued financial support. Meanwhile, we hope to start using the garage in about 90 days. When everything is completed, we will be able to consecrate the new Cathedral to the glory of God. We are hoping this will take place to coincide with our 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary, in 2021. God will bless us, indeed, if His All Holiness, Ecumenical Patriarch Bartholomew, who laid the cornerstone back in 1997, also consecrates it to God’s glory! Now is let us to resolve to move full-speed ahead to complete what we’ve begun!
