PALM SUNDAY: BEGINNING OF PASSION WEEK, CULMINATING IN THE RESURRECTION FROM THE DEAD OF OUR LORD JESUS CHRIST

EPISTLE READING OF THE DAY: This morning's Epistle Reading is from Saint Paul's Letter to Philippians, chapter 4, verse 4-9. It is found in our books on pages 146.

THE RAISING OF THE CROSS!

The large cross, which will go over the dome, and which measures 9 feet and weighs 470 pounds, is about to be raised over the dome. We hope today to announce the exact day and time for this significant event. The smaller cross, which will go over the entrance, above the Narthex, is 4'10" and weighs less. Our plan is to bring it to the site and display it in the chapel until the tile roof is completed, in about 2 months. At that time it, too, will be positioned in place. As for the large cross over the dome, the plan is to light it, for the first time, at Pascha. Meanwhile, some one out there may want the privilege of placing the cross above the dome, or above the narthex, thus essentially donating the dome or the narthex. Father Stephen is looking for a donation of \$1 million and is confident one of you will step up for this honor. To mark the completion of the exterior of the building, later this year, and to celebrate our 95th year as a community, we will hold a **Gala event on November 5**. Now, for the interior of the Cathedral: with God's help, we hope to be able to complete it by the end of 2017, and to consecrate the Cathedral to the glory of God to coincide with our 100th anniversary in 2021. God will bless us, indeed, if it is His Will that His All Holiness, Ecumenical Patriarch Bartholomew, who laid the cornerstone back in 1997, also consecrates it to God's glory in 2021!

May God enable our undertaking, and may God continue to inspire you and generations to come through this landmark house of worship, which you are building to glorify His holy Name.
