

EPISTLE READING OF THE DAY: This morning's Apostolic Reading is from the second Letter of Saint Paul to the Corinthians, Chapter 1, Verse 21 through Chapter 2, Verse 4. It is found in our books on page 112.

GREEK SCHOOL, SUNDAY SCHOOL: Greek School resumed yesterday and Sunday School resumes this morning. We are pleased to note the enthusiasm among both our staff (more teachers volunteering/great programs) and our students (more hands on learning); they eagerly look forward to the start of the school year. We invoke God's richest blessings upon our teachers and our young people, as we grow in the ways of the Lord, in the Orthodox Christian tradition, and as we learn our Greek language and heritage.

DANCE PRACTICE: Dance practice continues today, following the Divine Liturgy and every Sunday, up to FDF (in February), following the Divine Liturgy. We are pleased to report we have more young people this year than ever. For the first time in a long time we have 5 groups. The groups are: *To Mellon* (pre-K, K), *To Mellon 2* (1st-3rd grades), *Thisavri* (4th-6th grades), *Spithes* (7th-11th grades), and *Megalopolis* (adults).
