SUNDAY BEFORE THE NATIVITY

THE 10 MARTYRS OF GREECE

EPISTLE READING: This morning's Apostolic reading is from St. Paul's letter to the Hebrews, Chapter 11, Verses 9-10, 32-40. It is found in our books, on pages 150-151.

As the faithful, we both praise and worship Him for, in the flesh did He consent to ascend unto the Cross, and death did He endure, and the dead He raised unto life though His all-glorious Resurrection.

CHURCH SERVICES THIS WEEK: Tomorrow is Christmas Eve. The Great Hours will be read, beginning at 9 a.m. They will be followed by the Vesperal Divine Liturgy of St. Basil the Great, beginning at 10 a.m. Tuesday is Christmas Day. Orthros will be celebrated beginning at 9 a.m., followed by the Divine Liturgy, at 10:00 a.m. Traditional Christmas carols will be sung at the conclusion of the Divine Liturgy. The Cathedral invites you to worship with us, as it extends to all of you, best wishes for a blessed Christmas, and a joyous, peaceful New Year.

PARKING: For the time being, Golden State Parking, the valet company, parks our cars on Sunday mornings. We drop off and pick up our cars at the entrance. We do not go down into the garage ourselves. For this service, we've been paying \$5, essentially to cover the cost of the attendants. Meanwhile, we have signed a 6-month trial agreement with the valet company so that, as soon as it obtains the necessary permits, it can operate the parking weekdays, as well. We anticipate this service will begin February 1. When it does, we will no longer be paying to park when we come to church for Sunday services.

WHAT NEXT? As you can see, we're winding down Phase 1 of construction. We have a little way to go, however, in order to complete the fountain, the gates along Valencia Street, the exterior doors, etc. This takes time, especially in this challenging building climate and, of course, money. In order to complete these tasks and begin working on Phase 2 (the interior), we will need to embark upon a renewed Capital Campaign. (More about this in the New Year). Let's stay positive and focused. Consider what you have accomplished so far. As with Moses, we hear God speaking to us: "Build me a Sanctuary, and I will appear among you." (from the Septuagint: Kai ποιήσεις μοι άγίασμα, και όφθήσομαι έν ὑμῖν). (Exodus 25:8). Building also takes vision, determination and faith. You are doing something extraordinary: you are building His sanctuary, a sacred space, right the heart of one of the world's premier cities. Here, the Orthodox Christian faith is poised to proclaim the Gospel message of salvation to a whole new generation of worshipers!
