SUNDAY AFTER THE NATIVITY

ANYSIA THE RIGHTEOUS; GEDEON THE YOUNGER

EPISTLE READING: This morning's Apostolic reading is from St. Paul's letter to the Galatians, Chapter 1, Verses 11-19. It is found in our books, on pages 153.

Ὅτε δὲ εὐδόκησεν ὁ θεὸς ὁ ἀφορίσας με ἐκ κοιλίας μητρός μου καὶ καλέσας διὰ τῆς χάριτος αὐτοῦ, ἀποκαλύψαι τὸν υίὸν αὐτοῦ ἐν ἐμοὶ ἵνα εὐαγγελίζωμαι αὐτὸν ἐν τοῖς ἔθνεσιν, εὐθέως οὐ προσανεθέμην σαρκὶ καὶ αἵματι· οὐδὲ ἀνῆλθον εἰς Ἱεροσόλυμα πρὸς τοὺς πρὸ ἐμοῦ ἀποστόλους, ἀλλὰ ἀπῆλθον εἰς Αραβίαν, καὶ πάλιν ὑπέστρεψα εἰς Δαμασκόν. Ἐπειτα μετὰ ἔτη τρία ἀνῆλθον εἰς Ἱεροσόλυμα ίστορῆσαι Πέτρον, καὶ ἐπέμεινα πρὸς αὐτὸν ἡμέρας δεκαπέντε. Έτερον δὲ τῶν ἀποστόλων οὐκ είδον, εὶ μὴ Ἰάκωβον τὸν ἀδελφὸν τοῦ κυρίου.

GOSPEL READING OF THE DAY: This morning's Gospel Reading is from the Holy Gospel according to St. Matthew, Chapter 2, Verses 13-23. It is found in our books on pages 317-319.

You did vanquish Hades and, uncorrupted by its touch, You came unto the Virgin bestowing the gift of life. From the dead You arose, O Lord: we give glory to You.

SUNDAY/GREEK SCHOOL: There is no Sunday School today. Sunday School will resume next Sunday, January 6. Greek School resumes Saturday, January 5.

DANCE PRACTICE: Dance practice will take place today, beginning at 12 noon, and also on Saturday, January 5, beginning at 10:00 a.m.

ELEMENTARY/ MIDDLE SCHOOL BASKETBALL: Basketball Practice will take place this week on Wednesday, January 2 and on Thursday, January 3, beginning at 7 p.m.

CHURCH SERVICES THIS WEEK: As noted in the January 2019 Herald, Tuesday, January 1 is a holy day. First, it is the feast of the Circumcision of the Lord, as it is the eighth day following the Nativity, It is also the Feast of St. Basil the Great, whose Divine Liturgy we celebrate. Though not a religious holiday, January 1 is also New Year's Day, as it marks the beginning of the Roman tax year. The ecclesiastical New Year begins September 1. The Orthros will be celebrated beginning at 9 a.m., followed by the Divine Liturgy, at 10 a.m.

Meanwhile, this weekend begins the Feat of Holy Theophany. Also known as Epiphany, the feast celebrates the Baptism of Jesus. On Saturday, January 5, the Great Hours will be read, beginning at 9 a.m. This will be followed by the Vesperal Divine Liturgy of St. Basil, at 10 a.m. The Agiasmos service will be celebrated at the conclusion of the Divine Liturgy. On Sunday, January 6, The Agiasmos service will be celebrated at the conclusion of the Doxology, just before the Divine Liturgy. At the conclusion of Sunday's Liturgy, the oath of office will be administered to the newly elected members of the Parish Council. Afterwards, the Parish Council will meet and elect officers for 2019.

PARKING: For the time being, Golden State Parking, the valet company, parks our cars on Sunday mornings. We drop off and pick up our cars at the entrance. We do not go down into the garage ourselves. For this service, we've been paying \$5, essentially to cover the cost of the attendants. Meanwhile, we have signed a 6-month trial agreement with the valet company so that, as soon as it obtains the necessary permits, it can operate the parking weekdays, as well. We anticipate this service will begin February 1. When it does, we will no longer be paying to park when we come to church for Sunday services.

VASILOPITA/CRAB FEED: Our parish Vasilopita and also the Crab Feed, both sponsored by our Cathedral Ladies Philoptochos, are just around the corner. The Vasilopita will take place next Sunday, January 6 (on Holy Theophany), while the Crab Feed will take place Friday, January 25.

WHAT NEXT? As you can see, we're winding down Phase 1 of construction. We have a little way to go, however, in order to complete the fountain, the gates along Valencia Street, the exterior doors, etc. This takes time, especially in this challenging building climate and, of course, money. In order to complete these tasks and begin working on Phase 2 (the interior), we will need to embark upon a renewed Capital Campaign. (More about this in the New Year). Let's stay positive and focused. Consider what you have accomplished so far. As with Moses, we hear God speaking to us: "Build me a Sanctuary, and I will appear among you." (from the Septuagint: Καὶ ποιήσεις μοι ἀγίασμα, καὶ ὀφθήσομαι ἐν ὑμῖν). (Exodus 25:8). Building also takes vision, determination and faith. You are doing something extraordinary: you are building His sanctuary, a sacred space, right the heart of one of the world's premier cities. Here, the Orthodox Christian faith is poised to proclaim the Gospel message of salvation to a whole new generation of worshipers!
