## THE FIFTEENTH SUNDAY OF LUKE

### TRANSPOSITION OF THE RELICS OF SAINT JOHN CHRYSOSTOM

EPISTLE READING: This morning's Apostolic reading is from St. Paul's letter to the Hebrews, Chapter 7, Verses 26-28, Chapter 8, Verses 1-2: Brethren, it was fitting that we should have such a high priest, holy, blameless, unstained, separated from sinners, exalted above the heavens. He has no need, like those high priests, to offer sacrifices daily, first for his own sins and then for those of the people; he did this once for all when he offered up himself. Indeed, the law appoints men in their weakness as high priests, but the word of the oath, which came later than the law, appoints a Son who has been made perfect for ever. Now the point in what we are saying is this: we have such a high priest, one who is seated at the right hand of the throne of the Majesty in heaven, a minister in the sanctuary and the true tent which is set up not by man but by the Lord.

**DIVINE LITURGY THIS WEEK: 1)** January 30 is the Feast of the 3 Hierarchs: Basil the Great, Gregory the Theologian, and John Chrysostom. While each of these great saints is remembered separately, they are also remembered collectively as the "Three Hierarchs." The Divine Liturgy will be celebrated this Wednesday, beginning at 10 am. **2)** 40 days following the Nativity, February 2 is the Feast known as Ypapanti, i.e. "Meeting." The meeting of the child Jesus with Simeon, who received him, the meeting of the God-man with His creation. The Divine Liturgy will be celebrated this Saturday, beginning at 10 a.m., with Orthros at 9 a.m.
