EPISTLE READING OF THE DAY: This morning's Apostolic Reading is from Saint Paul's Letter

to the Romans, Chapter 2, Verses 10-16: Brethren, glory and honor and peace for everyone who does good, the Jew first and also the Greek. For God shows no partiality. All who have sinned without the law will also perish without the law, and all who have sinned under the law will be judged by the law. For it is not the hearers of the law who are righteous before God, but the doers of the law who will be justified. When Gentiles who have not the law do by nature what the law requires, they are a law to themselves, even though they do not have the law. They show that what the law requires is written on their hearts, while their conscience also bears witness and their conflicting thoughts accuse or perhaps excuse them on that day when, according to my gospel, God judges the secrets of men by Christ Jesus.

And he said to them, "Follow me, and I will make you fishers of men." Immediately they left their nets and followed him. And going on from there he saw two other brothers, James the son of Zebedee and John his brother, in the boat with Zebedee their father, mending their nets, and he called them. Immediately they left their boat and their father, and followed him. And he went about all Galilee, teaching in their synagogues and preaching the gospel of the kingdom and healing every disease and every infirmity among the people.

REOPENING OF OUR CHURCH: On Monday, June 15, 2020 San Francisco's Health Officer directed that "religious gatherings and ceremonies" may take place "outdoors only (up to 12 people), with face coverings and social distancing." This means that Annunciation Cathedral may not open, as planned, on July 5, with up to 40 congregants, as recently announced. Inasmuch as an outdoor Liturgy for up to 12 people is impractical, especially since self-park, utilizing the garage, is still an issue, for the foreseeable future worshipers are invited to continue to participate in the Sunday services and special weekday services (as for example, August 15), remotely, through streaming. The announcement by the City states: "This Directive goes into effect on June 15, 2020, and remains in effect until suspended, superseded, or amended by the Health Officer...under the authority of California Health and Safety Code Sections 101040, 101085, and 120175." We are, of course, saddened that we may not open up for in-person worship, for the time being. However, the safety of our people is paramount. Let us continue to pray for one another, looking ahead to the day when we can gather, once again, in our church.

All meetings, as Parish Council, Philoptochos, religious instruction, and youth are taking place remotely.

THINGS BEGINNING TO MOVE: The present pandemic has put everything building-related on hold but, now, things are beginning to move again. The granite which will clad the Valencia Street walls and the stone cap have been installed. The roofing and drainage issues are being addressed as we write this. The gate people are due to come out in a week to complete their work. As soon as we finish this and get our certificate of occupancy for the garage, we can open the garage to self-park. This is necessary if we are to open up the church, as the valet can guide us where to park, but can no longer park our cars for us. As a community, we've been through much, especially when we lost everything to the earthquake, back in 1989. But, we've bounced back. It wasn't easy, but we did it, because we have faith, we have hope, and we have unity. So, too, we will weather this pandemic and return to a so called "new normal," – i.e. a community where social distancing will become routine. But, our faith remains the same; our need for God remains the same. After all, it is for Him, in Him, and through Him that we continue to exist at all. Praise God for the Gift of His Son, our Lord Jesus Christ, through whom we are given the faith and the vision to rebuild His Church.
