SUNDAY OF THE PUBLICAN AND THE PHARISEE

EPISTLE READING OF THE DAY: This morning's Epistle Reading is from the Letter of Saint Paul to the Romans, chapter 8, verses 28-39: Brethren, we know that in everything God works for good with those who love him, who are called according to his purpose. For those whom he foreknew he also predestined to be conformed to the image of his Son, in order that he might be the first-born among many brethren. And those whom he predestined he also called; and those whom he called he also justified; and those whom he justified he also glorified. What then shall we say to this? If God is for us, who is against us? He who did not spare his own Son but gave him up for us all, will he not also give us all things with him? Who shall bring any charge against God's elect? It is God who justifies; who is to condemn? Is it Christ Jesus, who died, yes, who was raised from the dead, who is at the right hand of God, who indeed intercedes for us? Who shall separate us from the love of Christ? Shall tribulation, or distress, or persecution, or famine, or nakedness, or peril, or sword? As it is written, "For thy sake we are being killed all the day long; we are regarded as sheep to be slaughtered." No, in all these things we are more than conquerors through him who loved us. For I am sure that neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor principalities, nor things present, nor things to come, nor powers, nor height, nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord.

GOSPEL READING OF THE DAY: This morning's Gospel Reading is from the Holy Gospel according Luke, chapter 18, verses 10-14. It is found in our books on pages 275.

Today's Apolytikion (Dismissal Hymn) is that of Tone One:

The stone that had been sealed before your tomb by the Jews, and the soldiers guarding did watch over Your pure and sacred Body, O Savior, the third day You arose, and unto all the world did You give life. Whereby all the heavenly powers did proclaim that You are the giver of life. Glory unto our resurrected Christ, glory unto your Kingdom, glory to your Dispensation, O You who alone love mankind.

THE MARTYR TRYPHON; THE NEW MARTYR ANASTASIOS

TODAY'S MNEMOSYNON: This morning's memorial services are being offered for the repose of the soul of our sister Maria Karas (Karamountzos), who fell asleep in the Lord six years ago.

THE TRIODION BEGINS TODAY: The *Triodion* refers to the service book that provides the texts for the divine services for the pre-Lenten weeks of preparation (beginning with the Sunday of the Publican and the Pharisee), as well as the divine services during the Great Lent, including Holy Week. Its general theme is that of repentance.

SERVICES TOMORROW: Tomorrow is the Feast of the Presentation of our Lord, 40 days after His birth in the flesh. The Feast is also known as "*Ypapanti*" or "Meeting," referring to the meeting between the God-Man, Jesus Christ, and Simeon who, when he held the Child, uttered, "Lord, now You are letting Your servant depart in peace, according to Your word; for my eyes have seen your salvation, which you have prepared before the face of all peoples, a light to bring revelation to the Gentiles, and the glory of Your people Israel." Simeon recognized the baby Jesus as the Savior of the world.

Orthros will begin at 9:00 a.m., followed by the Divine Liturgy, at 10:00 a.m. At the conclusion, the service of *Artoklasia* will be offered (lit. "breaking of bread") by the Navarino Messinian Society.

DANCE PRACTICE TODAY: Dance practice will take place today, following the Divine Liturgy, noon to 4:00 p.m.

BASKETBALL PRACTICE: Basketball practice, as scheduled, will take place in our gym on Tuesday, February 3 and on Thursday, February 5, 7:00 p.m. to 8:30 p.m.

YEAR END SUMMARY OF GIVING: Please pardon us. Earlier this month, we mailed you a summary of giving for 2014. This included everything you gave for Stewardship, Christmas, Easter, etc. It did not, however, include your giving to the Capital Campaign (Building Fund) or memorial donations. A summary of this giving was mailed out subsequently. By now, you should have both summaries, if applicable. We apologize for any confusion this may have caused, as we endeavor to keep your financial records as accurate as possible.

WE MADE IT TO \$1 MILLION AND BEYOND/THE DECK IS NOW COMPLETE. Together with the most recent pledge to the Capital Campaign of our Ladies Philoptochos, we made it to \$1 million (and beyond). That's a million dollars given and pledged since the October 17, 2013 issuance of our building permit—25 years to the day of Loma Prieta What an accomplishment! Last week alone, we deposited over \$50,000 in gifts. If we keep up this pace, we will finish and pay off our building in no time.

Meanwhile, the deck is now complete. The perimeter walls have also been constructed. The garage ramp will be poured tomorrow. Late February or early March, we will watch the vertical steel being erected. What a blessing! Meanwhile, our goal is to get the parking structure up and running as soon as possible, certainly by Crab Feed time next year. The exterior of the building should be completed by the end of 2015 and work should begin on the interior shortly thereafter, depending upon the success of our fund raising efforts. We need your continued monetary support and we need your prayers. All the donors' names (\$1,000 gift minimum) will eventually be inscribed on the dedication wall in the new Cathedral, where prayers will be constantly offered "for the blessed and ever-memorable founders and benefactors of this Holy Church." Your children and their children should be able to look up one day and see your name on the dedication wall.

In the Book of Exodus (25:8) God says: "Build me a Sanctuary, and I will appear among you." (Translated from the Septuagint: Καὶ ποιήσεις μοι ἀγίασμα, καὶ ὀφθήσομαι ἐν ὑμῖν). We've quoted this at least since the start of the Capital Campaign, and we are keeping this "immovable before our eyes," as Deut. 6:8 states, as we rebuild the Cathedral to God's glory, to serve our faithful and all God's people in this blessed dynamic heart of San Francisco.
