EPISTLE READING OF THE DAY: This morning's Apostolic Reading is from Saint Paul's Letter to the Colossians, Chapter 3, Verses 4-11. It is found on our books on page 129.

PARISH COUNCIL ELECTIONS TODAY: Today, parishioners in good standing will have the opportunity to elect members to the Parish Council for a two-year term, beginning January 1, 2016. This year, there are eight vacancies (8 members of the 15 member Parish Council are elected one year, and 7 the next). Since fewer than eight candidates attended the required seminar on December 2, the names of those who attended will appear on the ballot. Once these four individuals take their oath of office and the Parish Council meets on January 3 to elect its officers for 2016, it will also elect an additional four members from among the members in good standing of the Parish to serve on the Parish Council, so that the Parish Council will continue to have 15 lay members, plus the Cathedral Dean. Phil and Annette Chiappari and Bill Tonas will oversee the elections.

MEETING OF PARENTS WHO HAVE GOYA-AGE CHILDREN (13 to 18 years of age): We've polled the parents and today, <u>Sunday</u>, <u>December 13</u> appears to be the best date for the parents to meet to discuss our GOYA program, staffing, and vision. The meeting will take place in the chapel following the Divine Liturgy and should last no more than 45 minutes. (If the Divine Liturgy concludes by noon, the meeting will take place immediately afterwards. If not, inasmuch as we have a baptism today at 12:30 p.m., the meeting will take place here in the chapel at 1 p.m. We apologize for any inconvenience, but are mindful that most parents have children who are attending dance practice, and are here until 2 p.m. anyway.)

**SOUP KITHCEN THIS TUESDAY, DECEMBER 15:** Although the Soup Kitchen is a Parish-wide undertaking, we are grateful to our Young Adults for taking the lead in preparing and serving the food at our Soup Kitchen the third Tuesday of every month. This month, the Soup Kitchen will take place on Tuesday, December 15, 6:30 p.m. to 8:30 p.m. Last month, we had our greatest attendance ever---over 50 guests! For the December Soup Kitchen, members of the Cathedral Ladies Philoptochos have expressed an interest in attending and helping out. Thank you, all for, in feeding the hungry, you are feeding Christ Himself.

**NEXT SUNDAY: SUNDAY SCHOOL CHRISTMAS PROGRAM:** Next Sunday, December 20, we will have our Christmas program by our Sunday School children, followed by a luncheon, to be prepared by our Sunday School parents. The Parish Council will also meet, in the second floor conference room. Because of the program and the luncheon, the meeting of the Parish Council will begin at 12:30 p.m.

**COMMUNITY LINK THIS SATURDAY:** Community Link, which is our real-life physical link to our inbound seniors, will be meeting at the Cathedral Saturday, December 19, beginning at 9 a.m. From there, the members will take a small Christmas remembrance, including little trees, as they did last year, along with Christmas greeting cards. **ALMOST THERE:** We are completely done with metal stud framing and exterior Densglass (the yellow panels you see on the outside). Plywood and wood blocking are now complete on all tile roof areas, as well as the domes. Waterproofing is now being done, with window installation, lath, and plaster to follow. Then, the exterior of the building will be virtually complete.

Excitement mounts as we watch this magnificent structure evolve, as it represents everything we are and everything we believe as Greek Orthodox Christians. It is also a symbol of the faith that our own generation has cultivated, and what we hope to leave behind, to inspire the generations to come.

We've noted on a number of occasions that we have raised \$6 million towards this project, with another \$4.7 to go. And we have explained how much has been spent and on what. Additionally, we have projected a timetable for completion of the project--summer of 2016; this includes the normal functioning of the garage. At that point, we are planning to hold a **Gala event**, to celebrate a great accomplishment, as we turn to Phase two (the completion of the interior). Work on the interior, including appointments and iconography, should take another year or so. Certainly, we hope to be able to plan for its consecration, in 2017, four years before our 100th anniversary. All this, of course, will depend upon your prayers and continued support.

May God bless our undertaking, for God is the one who spoke to Moses, then, and who speaks to us, today, saying: "Build me a Sanctuary, and I will appear among you." (Translated from the Septuagint: Καὶ ποιήσεις μοι ἀγίασμα, καὶ ὀφθήσομαι ἐν ὑμῖν). (Exodus 25:8). May we prove worthy of the trust God has in us to rebuild His Church.
