AMPHILOCHIOS OF ICONIUM, GREGORY OF AKRAGAS, DIONYSIOS PATRIARCH OF C/PLE

EPISTLE READING OF THE DAY: This morning's Epistle Reading is from the Letter of Saint Paul to the Ephesians, chapter 2, verses 14-22. It is found in our books on page 124.

Ἄρα οὖν οὐκέτι ἐστὲ ξένοι καὶ πάροικοι, ἀλλὰ συμπολῖται τῶν άγίων καὶ οἰκεῖοι τοῦ θεοῦ, ἐποικοδομηθέντες ἐπὶ τῷ θεμελίω τῶν ἀποστόλων καὶ προφητῶν, ὄντος ἀκρογωνιαίου αὐτοῦ Ἰησοῦ Χριστοῦ, ἐν ῷ πᾶσα οἰκοδομὴ συναρμολογουμένη αὔξει εἰς ναὸν ἄγιον ἐν κυρίω, ἐν ῷ καὶ ὑμεῖς συνοικοδομεῖσθε εἰς κατοικητήριον τοῦ θεοῦ ἐν πνεύματι.

GOSPEL READING OF THE DAY: This morning's Gospel Reading is from the Holy Gospel according to St. Luke, chapter 12, verses 16-21. It is found in our books, pages 259-261.

Today's Apolytikion (Dismissal Hymn) is that of Tone Seven (Grave):

O Lord, by your sacred Cross You abolished death and granted to the thief blessed paradise. The myrrh bearers ceased lamenting and turned to joy. The Apostles did preach the Good News at your command—that You had risen from the dead, O Christ our God, bestowing your mercy on the world evermore.

2015 STEWARDSHIP MAILING HAS GONE OUT: This year, in the interest of simplicity (i.e. cost-savings) our 2015 Stewardship Campaign is simple: PLEASE SUPPORT YOUR CHURCH. The timing is critical. It's easy to put church on the back burner, so to speak, or to let others worry about it. Yet, every one of us has been called to be a Steward. Every one of us has been baptized into Christ. Every one of us has put on Christ. Every one of us has been called to proclaim Christ.

Read it to your spouses and to your children. Then, pray about it and decide your level of support for 2015. Recall the words of St. Paul to the Church in Corinth: *Give what you have decided in your heart to give, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver.* (2 Cor. 9:7).

What we are asking for 2015 is that you also consider what you might be able to give *each month* to support your community and its ministries. This will greatly help the Cathedral with its budget management. On November 12, the Stewardship Committee will convene to further consider our stewardship goals for 2015 and to plan Stewardship Sunday, December 7, which will be offered through the generosity of Gus and Georgia Vouchilas.

A thought: In their book on Orthodox Christian leadership, entitled Oriented Leadership, Williams and McKibben, the authors, define stewardship as the call of the faithful to share willingly the gifts that God has bestowed on them. It is not simply the giving of a monetary sum. Rather stewardship is our active commitment to use all our time, talent and treasure for the benefit of humankind in grateful acknowledgment of Christ's redeeming love.

WE MADE IT TO \$1 MILLION! Together with the most recent gift to the Capital Campaign of our Ladies Philoptochos, we made it to \$1 million. That's a million dollars given and pledged since the October 17, 2013 issuance of our building permit—25 years to the day of Loma Prieta Wow! What an accomplishment. Go ahead and applaud yourselves. A job well done. If we keep doing this year after year, we will finish and pay off our building in no time.

Meanwhile, things are moving along and, now, quite rapidly. We have received all the rebar. The last delivery was on Friday. The rebar is being laid over the deck forming, now that the mechanical, electrical and plumbing conduits are in place. On December 8 (God willing, and weather permitting) we will have the first of two pours of concrete. The parking structure ceiling (which is also the Cathedral floor deck) will now be complete and the vertical steel will start going up. In the November Herald you no doubt saw photos of the dome steel. We can't wait to get to that point. However, we need you're your monetary support and we need your prayers. To date, we have just under 300 donors. This list needs to grow to at least 500. The donors' names (\$1,000 gift minimum) will be inscribed on the dedication wall in the new Cathedral, where prayers will be constantly offered "for the blessed and ever-memorable founders and benefactors of this Holy Church." Ask yourself, as you read this, is your name among them?

In the Book of Exodus (25:8) God says: "Build me a Sanctuary, and I will appear among you." (Translated from the Septuagint: Καὶ ποιήσεις μοι ἀγίασμα, καὶ ὀφθήσομαι ἐν ὑμῖν). We've quoted this at least since the start of the Capital Campaign, and we are keeping this "immovable before our eyes," as Deut. 6:8 states, as we rebuild the Cathedral to God's glory, to serve our faithful and all God's people in this blessed dynamic heart of San Francisco.
